# Webb shrugs off crash

DANNY WEBB had a spectacular crash while battling for points in the Moto GP 125 race at Jerez on Sunday.

Webb, of Tunbridge Wells, was picking off the places in the wet conditions and was on the verge of making his way into the top 10 when disaster happened.

His Mahindra Racing machine high-sided on lap 13 and Webb ended up in a heap after hitting the gravel trap.

After being carried away on a stretcher, he was examined by doctors and given the all-clear.

He said: "I started well but the group was coming at me from behind and I was pushing hard to keep ahead.

"My back tyre was sliding and maybe the setting was a bit soft. Then it suddenly let go and I spun out.

"I wasn't badly hurt and at least it was a strong race and I can come back stronger for the next one. These things happen."

SCOTT SMART has added his name to the bumper line-up for this season's British Superbike Championship.

The Maidstone rider will be fighting for the BSB Evo title with the Moto Rapido Ducati team. Smart rode in

the National Superstock 1000 Championship last season and is looking forward to a return to the top class.

He said: "I'm excited to be returning to the Superbike grid on what will probably be the most competitive bike I have ridden.

"Riding a Ducati also seems to be a part of the family heritage, so it's like being home."

The season opener at Brands Hatch takes place on April 24.

PHIL QUAIFFE made a strong start to his Le Mans Series title bid with a fourth place finish on the opening round.

Quaife, from Tonbridge, was competing in the prestigious endurance championship at the Paul Ricard circuit in France, alongside co-drivers Adam Christodoulou and Klaas Hummel.

Their CRS Racing Ferrari F430 led for much of the six-hour race and claimed a solid points haul in the first event of the five-round championship in the LM GTE Am class.

Quaife said: "It's a good start to the season and the team

did a great job throughout the weekend to get the car from where it was in Free Practice to where it ended up in the race.

"The starter motor issue probably cost us a shot at the class win but there is a long way to go this season and we showed enough potential to suggest that we can be championship challengers."

LOUISE COOK contested

her fourth gravel rally at the weekend in the Bulldog International Rally of North Wales but car problems left her and co-driver Stefan Davis unable to challenge the leaders.

The Maidstone pair tackled the huge Welsh course but early promise drifted away after the co-driver became lost on the notes.

It was the sign of things to come and, with warning lights flashing on the dashboard, it affected their performance.

By stage four, Cook had set a good time but mechanical problems crept back in. A change around of tyres led to failure in stage six and Cook was forced to eventually drive with a puncture.

"I have never driven on a puncture before and I actually learnt a lot. I had to drive much slower into every corner," she said.

With new tyres, Cook drove the last loop of the day, a repeat of stages 5, 6 and 7. With a massive time loss and nothing to gain, Cook enjoyed the practice.

"The rally didn't go to plan, they never do!" she said.

"I was so pleased to finish again, though, especially as o
